Melrose High School students and Year 6 students will be working in a dynamic environment to solve real world issues. Year 6 students will work in groups with Year 9 student leaders and teachers.

Using a Solution Fluency process, students will be presented with an opportunity to think creatively, solve problems, and develop appropriate solutions.

Each year the MHS thinking carnival focuses on an essential question (EQ) for learners. EQs are questions, which have multiple streams of exploration and inquiry, allow learners a high level of personalisation in their responses and can be framed from a local and global community perspective. The essential question we will be exploring in 2021 is:

“How do we find our purpose?”
